ADMISSIONS TIPS & HINTS

The MIT Program Faculty will admit in a given year all students that can be accommodated in clinical settings. Admission to all clinical tracks is competitive. If the student is not admitted they may accept a spot as an alternate. If spots open up before the start of the program, the student will be contacted and offered a seat in the class. Students enrolling in the non-clinical track need only meet the minimum academic requirements.
