Q&A with NICU Grad, Eleanor and Dad, Craig

NN: What is your favorite NICU memory?

Craig: It is so extremely hard to narrow things down to one specific memory.. Some highlights are definitely all the crafts of footprints that were made for us, being able to give Eleanor her first bath, and getting to dress her in clothes for first time.

NN: What was the best/most meaningful part of being a NICU parent?

Craig: I feel as though relationships we developed with Eleanor's care team. They helped guide us through so many challenges, kept us sane, and offered comfort when things didn't go as planned. They took such good care of our baby and our family!

NN: What was the greatest challenge for you as a NICU parent?

Craig: The greatest challenge we faced was adjusting to a new normal of what having a NICU baby would equate too. After 70 days, life changed. We began learning that blood transfusions, bradycardia, and that we would take steps forward only to take one backwards. The steps back could be most difficult to accept after things were going so smoothly.

NN: What is life like now, after the NICU?

Craig: We are in a new rhythm since leaving the NICU. We have returned to work, Eleanor now attends daycare. Although it has not been smooth as she had her first respiratory illness with a bout of pneumonia and a week back on oxygen. Thrown in with a few ear infections everything and some thickened feeds, we have learned to embrace the moments!
